FROM THE RECTOR.....

Stephen R. Covey died this week. He was the author of the best selling book *The Seven Habits of Highly Effective People*. I first read it when it was published in 1990. Thanks to Covey's writings, I had a Leadership Coach for years. My calendar from the Franklin-Covey Institute has always been the "Seven Habits Edition." I carry in my wallet a "Seven Habits Work Card" (which may surprise some, but then, ordained ministry is often more like parenthood than corporate management.) When I read of his death, I had to sit and let it sink in for a while. We can all think of a public figure or two whose deaths affect us this way.

To mention just some of the Seven Habits that are pretty much self-explanatory: "Be Proactive," that is, jump in, lead, be part of the solution, not part of the problem; "Put first things first"; "Think Win/Win"; "Seek first to Understand, then to be Understood," this last is perhaps my favorite--- how many conflicts, how much global terror and local nastiness could be avoided if this was everyone's mantra? And all Seven Habits are based upon principles such as fairness, integrity, honesty, nurturing, encouragement, human dignity, and service (the idea of making a contribution.) I will miss Stephen Covey. I know, though, that the Covey Institute will continue to conduct seminars, publish books, and make a fortune off of people like me.

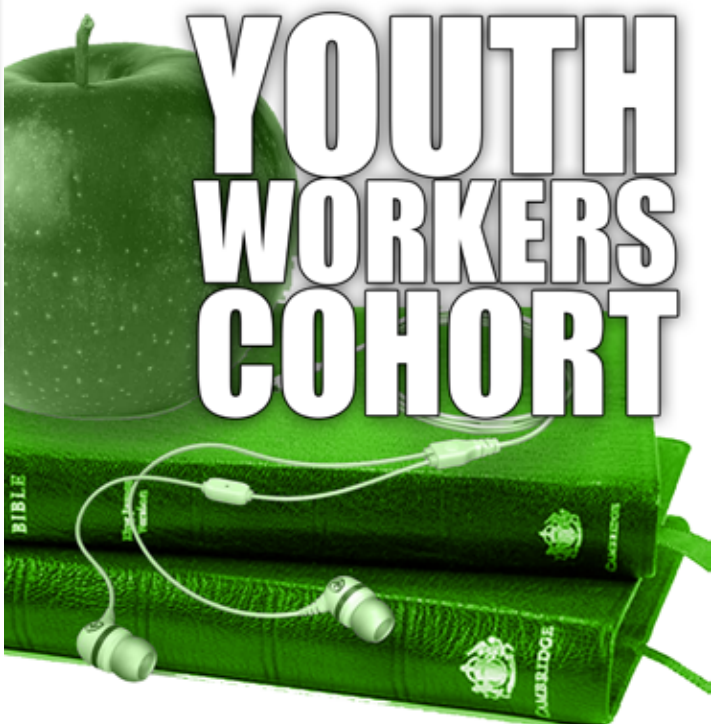

PARISH HOUSE UPDATE AS OF JULY 16TH
FROM THE FOLLOW-UP TEAM AND THE
CONSTRUCTION COMMITTEE.

We are now in the “value engineering phase” of the project, after having received a design development budget from American Constructors, our builder. The budget they presented was higher than anticipated and higher than the vestry-approved cost of \$1.75 million.

The past few weeks have been a very challenging part of this process. The builder and the architects are now reviewing choices of materials to be used as well as various design elements in order to reduce costs. They have assured us that they will “leave no stone unturned” to get within our approved budget. Over the next two to three weeks, and once we have revised cost information in hand, we will begin making decisions. We will continue to update you on our progress as soon as we have specific information in hand to report.

The current amount of pledges and gifts to the campaign is \$1,035,000. We have collected 38% of that amount to date, or, \$393,790.81.

The Construction Committee and the Follow-up Team thank everyone for the generous gifts to the campaign and we look forward to our continued success towards reaching our goal to build a new Parish House.

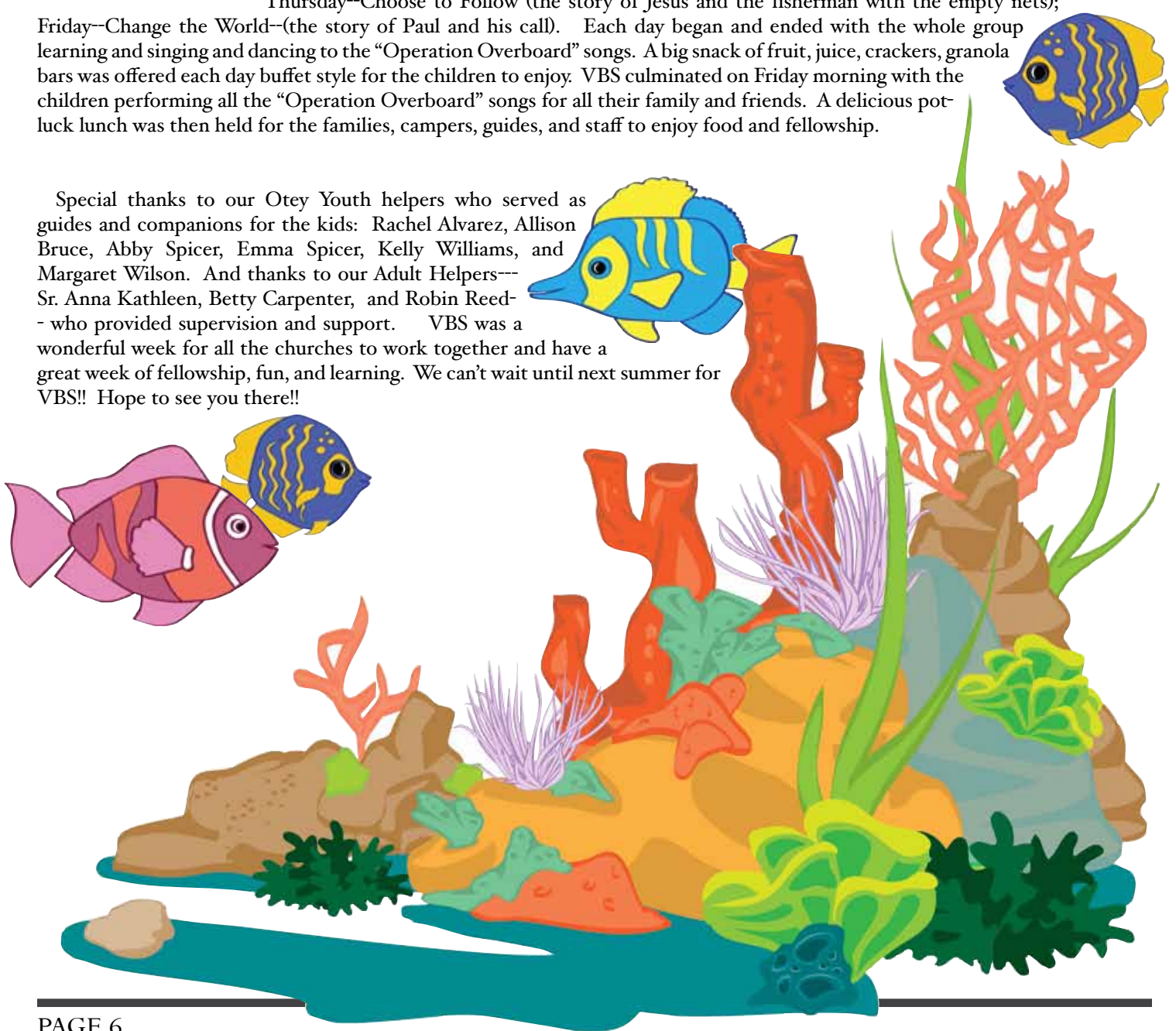


OPERATION OVERBOARD: GOING DEEP WITH GOD...

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL (VBS) was held this past week July 16-20 at St. James Episcopal Church in Midway from 9 a.m. until Noon each day. Otey Memorial Parish co-sponsors VBS each year with all the local Episcopal churches: Christ Church (Alto), Holy Comforter (Monteagle), St. James (Midway), and Trinity (Winchester). This year's theme was "Operation Overboard: Going Deep with God."

Over 50 children participated this past week. The children, ages 4-11, were divided into groups: Seals, Dolphins, Penguins, and Whales. Each group rotated through 4 stations daily: Bible Stories, Crafts, Recreation, and Science. Each day had a Biblical reflection and theme, and a Bible verse and song for the children to learn. These included: Monday-- Depend Upon God (the story of Noah and the flood); Tuesday--Dare to Care (the story of Naiman's servant girl); Wednesday--Claim Jesus (the story of John the Baptist); Thursday--Choose to Follow (the story of Jesus and the fisherman with the empty nets); Friday--Change the World--(the story of Paul and his call). Each day began and ended with the whole group learning and singing and dancing to the "Operation Overboard" songs. A big snack of fruit, juice, crackers, granola bars was offered each day buffet style for the children to enjoy. VBS culminated on Friday morning with the children performing all the "Operation Overboard" songs for all their family and friends. A delicious pot-luck lunch was then held for the families, campers, guides, and staff to enjoy food and fellowship.
